




# CALL FOR ARTICLE SUBMISSIONS CARIBBEAN JOURNAL OF CRIMINOLOGY

The Caribbean Journal of Criminology (CJC) is a peer-reviewed journal of The University of the West Indies (UWI). The CJC primarily aims to promote critical examination of the difficult, complex and persistent crime problems in the Caribbean. The journal values diversity of perspectives and therefore invites contributions from researchers within and outside of the region, particularly from other developing countries. The CJC is multi-disciplinary and welcomes articles regardless of their theoretical bent, methodology and disciplinary training.

The journal is now published annually in December and marketed by UWI Press for the Institute of Criminal Justice and Security (ICJS). Represented on the editorial board of the journal are academics from UWI campuses and accomplished researchers from universities in North America, Europe, and other regions of the world.

The CJC is a continuation of the Caribbean Journal of Criminology and Social Psychology and the Caribbean Journal of Criminology and Public Safety.

- Youth delinquency & offending
- The Global South and criminological theory
- Work that has researched good/best practices in crime prevention in the Caribbean

## ARTICLE SUBMISSIONS

For the 2021 issue, which will be guest edited by Edward Maguire and Charles Katz at Arizona State University, the theme will be "international research partnerships". The journal seeks contributions authored by teams from two or more nations. At least one of the authors should be from the Caribbean. Authors are cordially invited to submit articles of high-quality, unpublished, original work consistent with the theme of the special issue, before the close of submissions on Friday July 30, 2021. ## SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Papers must be submitted in English and in MS Word. Authors are asked to ensure that the submitted manuscripts strictly adhere to guidelines found at <https://dhjkhxawhe8q4.cloudfront.net/uwi-press-wp/wp-content/uploads/2020/01/09194642/guidelines-for-manuscript-submission-edited.pdf>

Once authors have submitted their paper, an email confirmation will be sent acknowledging receipt. A reference number will also be provided in the email which authors are encouraged to use in all related correspondence. Article submissions will be rigorously reviewed by at least two subject matter experts.
