BJS has released three datasets from the [National Corrections Reporting Program \(NCRP\)](#) through the National Archive of Criminal Justice Data (NACJD).

The NCRP compiles offender-level data on admissions and releases from state and federal prisons and post-confinement community supervision.

The data are used to monitor the nation's correctional population and address specific policy questions related to recidivism, prisoner reentry, and trends in demographic characteristics of the incarcerated and community supervision populations.
