

Invitation to Join a Book Project on “Men and their Welfare”

Dear colleagues

I am co-editing a book with Dr Anna Tarrant and Dr Laura Way titled ‘Men and their Welfare’. This proposed landmark collection will explore the complex and shifting relationship between men, welfare and policy in contemporary context and is inspired by themes examined in ‘Men, Gender Divisions and Welfare’ (Popay et al, Routledge, 1998). Our collection represents an opportunity to produce an up-to date account of the gendered and social implications of policy and practice change for men, as well as their inherent contradictions and complexities, tracing both stability and change over the past twenty-two years.

Following four highly receptive reviews, we are currently finalising our chapter structure for the collection and would like to invite proposals for a chapter on **men’s welfare in justice settings or men and domestic abuse**. We recognise these intersections as pertinent to questions of the complex and evolving relationships between men and welfare yet all too often they are overlooked. We hope to remedy this omission in this landmark collection.

To help you make an informed decision, we would ideally like to receive a first draft of your chapter in January 2022. We expect to submit a final manuscript to Routledge early 2023. If you would like to discuss further please contact me: lladlow@lincoln.ac.uk
