Reminder! There are approximately three weeks left to apply under the Collaborative Reform Initiative (CRI) Program Solicitation! This solicitation is open only to for-profit (commercial) organizations, nonprofit organizations, and institutions of higher education.

The 2022 CRI program is a competitive solicitation that is seeking applications for the Critical Response and Organizational Assessment components of the CRI only (to read more about the CRI Continuum, please see the [CRI Fact Sheet](#)):

**1. Critical Response.** The Critical Response program is designed to provide targeted TA to law enforcement agencies experiencing high profile events, major incidents, or sensitive issues of varying need. Critical Response is highly customizable and provides flexible assistance to law enforcement agencies in a variety of ways including after-action reviews, peer-to-peer exchanges; targeted in-depth review, analysis, and recommendations; and facilitated discussions with subject matter experts (SME). Critical Response sites may vary in duration, depending upon the scope of the project. Shorter-term executive consultations may take as little as two weeks, while in-depth reviews of specific incidents or issues will take between six and nine months. *One award, up to \$1 million.*

**2. Organizational Assessments.** Organizational Assessments offers the most intensive form of technical assistance on the continuum, involving in-depth assessments and long-term assistance on systemic issues that can challenge community trust and confidence. The ideal timeline for engagements will be a 12-month period after the intake process is completed, with the maximum time for engagements to be 18 months. During that period, it will be the responsibility of all involved parties to accomplish the mutual goal of police reform while acknowledging that sustaining these efforts ultimately must be the responsibility of local agencies and communities. *One award, up to \$5 million.*
