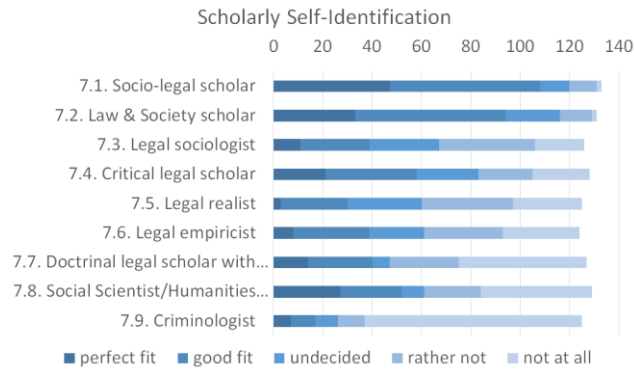
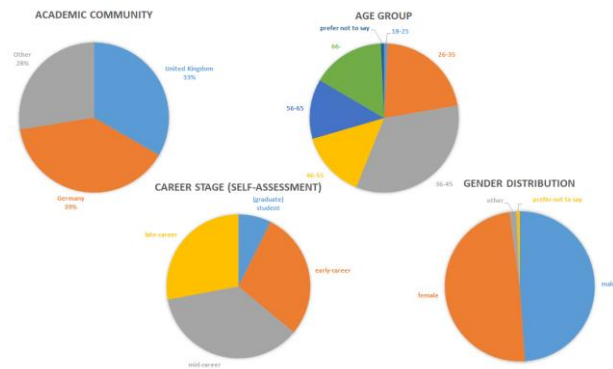


Help create comparative data on the socio-legal communities in Germany, the UK, and beyond!

We are a team of researchers working on a bi-national, comparative research project examining [the contours and cultures in the field of law and society in Germany and the UK](#).

We are addressing a real research gap, since very little comparative scholarship exists on the emergence and the state of law and society studies in the UK and Germany. Hardly any data is available on research environments and communities upon which such analyses could be based.



This is why we designed a [survey](#) to explore how academic biographies and identities, career paths, and conditions for teaching and research are embedded in the institutional landscapes and academic histories of the two countries.

The data in this survey will be published as open data (in aggregate form where necessary) after the conclusion of the project (in 2023) to allow other researchers to verify our findings and do secondary analyses.

Although the focus for this project are Germany and the UK, we are interested to add more countries and contexts to the mix as we progress our fieldwork.

So far, we have 160+ responses. This is great! However, we know that a higher number of participants would allow us to get an even better understanding of the emerging fields.
