JuvJust USA: New CDC Report Highlights Youth Risk Behavior Challenges

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) released the “[Youth Risk Behavior Survey Data Summary & Trends Report: 2011-2021](#).” This survey was developed to monitor health behaviors that contribute to death, disability, and social problems among youth in the United States.

This report focuses on behaviors and experiences among U.S. high school students related to their mental health and well-being, including substance use, experiences of violence, and sexual behavior. The data show that the same youth behaviors and experiences that were moving in the wrong direction before the pandemic, such as poor mental health, continued to worsen.

The Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) is announcing the release of *Criminal Victimization in the 22 Largest U.S. States, 2017–2019*, the first release of subnational violent and property victimization estimates from the National Crime Victimization Survey (NCVS). This report presents selected state-level estimates of violent and property victimization for the 3-year aggregate period of 2017-19 in the 22 most populous U.S. states. It offers the first picture of victimization rates across states and how their reported and unreported crime levels vary.

This report describes an assessment of the redesigned National Crime Victimization Survey (NCVS) sample design to (1) identify potential sources of error that may compromise the validity of state-level estimates and (2) evaluate how NCVS estimates compare with and augment estimates from the Federal Bureau of Investigation’s Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. This validation concluded that no issues were identified regarding the validity of state-level victimization estimates produced through the 2016 NCVS sample design. Additionally, the validation results will inform BJS’s ongoing subnational estimation work.

## Dataset now available: 2020 Law Enforcement Management and Administrative Statistics

The Bureau of Justice Statistics has released data from the 2020 Law Enforcement Management and Administrative Statistics (LEMAS) collection through the National Archive of Criminal Justice Data. LEMAS collects data from over 3,000 general-purpose state and local law enforcement agencies, including all those that employ 100 or more sworn officers and a nationally representative sample of smaller agencies. Data collected include—

- agency responsibilities
- operating expenditures
- officer salaries and special pay
- demographic characteristics of officers
- weapons policies
- education and training requirements
- computers and information systems
- community policing activities.

**This program aims to prevent sexual violence in middle school male athletes.** The program is rated No Effects. There were no statistically significant differences between treatment and control group athletes in reports of abuse (relationship, cybersexual, or sexual), sexual harassment, negative bystander behaviors, sex-equitable attitudes, or intention to intervene. Treatment group athletes reported statistically significantly more positive bystander behaviors and recognized more signs of abuse.

A no effects rating assigned to a practice outcome indicates that, on average, there is strong evidence that implementing a program encompassed by the practice will not achieve the intended outcome or may result in a negative outcome.

CrimeSolutions assigns ratings to programs based on the preponderance of evidence from up to three studies that have assessed outcomes related to crime, delinquency, or victimization prevention, intervention, or response.

**Term of the Month — Polyvictimization**

Each month, NIJ features a term from our scientific portfolios related to justice system issues and solutions. The term of the month for March, polyvictimization, can generally be defined as an experience or experiences of multiple types of violence, abuse, mistreatment, or other adversities. Polyvictimization typically refers to two or more different types of victimization — such as sexual violence and physical abuse — rather than multiple episodes of a single type of victimization.

**Location Data, Demographics, and Social Characteristics of Terrorist Acts**

A new NIJ-supported study combines two existing analytical tools — risk terrain modeling and conjunctive analysis — to link location and risk of terrorism. This approach identifies areas of high risk, providing opportunities for more effective interventions.

By combining data from multiple categories, the study aimed to generate findings of greater value to law enforcement and intelligence agencies, as well as the research community. This approach can be used to alert community members, as well as law enforcement, about possible locations of terrorist acts.

**Risk Reduction through Family Therapy for Adolescents Rated Promising with Mixed Results**

The goal of this exposure-based, integrative intervention was to reduce substance use and mental health problems in adolescents who have experienced trauma.

The program is rated Promising. The program had a statistically significant impact on depressive and internalizing symptoms, family cohesion, and family conflict. There were mixed results for

PTSD symptoms and substance use. There was no statistically significant impact on externalizing symptoms.

A Promising rating implies that implementing the program may result in the intended outcome(s). CrimeSolutions assigns ratings to programs based on the preponderance of evidence from up to three studies that have assessed outcomes related to crime, delinquency, or victimization prevention, intervention, or response.
