Police-Initiated Pedestrian Stops to Reduce Crime

Police-initiated stops involve police officers' stopping, questioning, and investigating pedestrians on the street, usually based on suspicion of criminal behavior or activity. Generally, the goal of the stops is to prevent or reduce the occurrence of crime and disorder. The practice is rated Promising for reducing measures of crime and displacement but was rated No Effects for improving measures of mental and physical health of citizens who were stopped by police.

Today, The Sentencing Project released a new report: **[“One in Five: How Mass Incarceration Deepens Inequality and Harms Public Safety.”](#)** This report, the final installment in the “One in Five” series, examines numerous criminal legal laws and policies – such as fines, fees, predatory pricing, exploitative wages, collateral consequences, and the diversion of effective investments in public safety – that exacerbate socioeconomic inequalities.

Certain regulations intensify the marginalization of justice-involved people – who are disproportionately people of color – by wearing down economic and social buffers against crime and increasing the likelihood of police contact.

States and local jurisdictions have initiated promising reforms that reduce the harms of criminal convictions and redirect resources to more effective interventions. Policymakers and practitioners must protect and expand these reforms to help

reduce the burden on those who, in many cases, are already at a socioeconomic disadvantage.

More 'Safe Spaces' for Young People could help Reduce Violence in Scotland

Over the last two decades, Scotland has witnessed a remarkable reduction in serious violence which has been especially evident in cities like Glasgow. However, while this success has been widely acknowledged, this reduction has slowed in recent years and a new report published today (Mon 15th) highlights concerns around how Scotland is adapting to emerging trends around violence and young people.

Researchers found that in the aftermath of Covid-19 and funding cuts to local services, physical spaces where activities and support had been organised for young people have now closed. In the absence of these 'safe spaces' young people are now drawn to digital spaces such as social media platforms where conflict and intimidation is becoming an increasing concern.

The research team based at the Universities of Glasgow, Edinburgh and the Open University interviewed 190 participants including third sector, healthcare, government, police, youth work and young people affected by violence as they sought to understand how Scotland reduced its rates of violence and what measures need to be taken to continue its progress. . Co-author of the report,

'Safe Space? The past and present of violence reduction

in Scotland', Professor Alistair Fraser, University of Glasgow, said: "The story of Scotland's violence is an important one to tell. Over the course of the last 20 years we have seen how a growing chorus of support for a public health approach to violence, led by the Scottish Violence Reduction Unit, which has brought about real change.
